ABOUT THE 2009 NEW MUSIC MIAMI ISCM FESTIVAL SERIES

The 2009 festival of contemporary cutting edge music and video art continues to build on the success of previous festivals and will focus on cutting edge solo, chamber, orchestral, electronic music and video art from around the world presented by some of the most exciting performers of contemporary music. This year's festival is being presented in a new format spread out over 5 months instead of 5 days. This will allow for more interaction between the guests, students, and the audiences. This year's festival will include concerts with works that have been impacted by world music and the environment, as well as concerts with video and other new forms of technology.
