

THE 2003 NEW MUSIC MIAMI ISCM FESTIVAL

The main activity of the Miami section of the ISCM during the 2002- 2032 season was the presentation of the 2003 New Music Miami ISCM Festival. The 2003 New Music Miami ISCM Festival included 15 renowned composers participating in the 3 day event held April 10, 11, and 12, 2003 at FIU's Wolfsonian Museum located at 1001 Washington Avenue on Miami Beach. Presented by the FIU School of Music, the focus of the festival was new solo and chamber music for strings. Five concerts were presented over the 3 days as well as pre-concert Meet the Composers sessions, in which the composers whose works were being performed discussed their music. All concerts were free and open to the public. Attendance was high and the concerts received very favorable reviews.
