ABOUT THE FESTIVAL

The 2005 New Music Miami ISCM Festival will include some 30 renowned composers and performers participating in the 3 day event being held April 14, 15, and 16, 2005 at the Wertheim Performing Arts Center on the University Park Campus of Florida International University (FIU) located at SW 8th Street and 107th Avenue in Miami and at the Steinway Piano Gallery, 4104 Ponce de Leon Blvd. in Coral Gables, FL. Presented by the FIU School of Music, the focus of this year's festival is new music for piano. The ISCM designation in the festival title indicates FIU's association with the International Society for Contemporary Music (ISCM); an organization dedicated to the dissemination of contemporary music throughout the world. Five concerts are being presented over the 3 days as well as pre-concert Meet the Composers panel sessions before each of the concerts, in which the composers whose works are being performed will discuss issues of relevance to their music. All pre-concert panel sessions and concerts are free and open to the public. A list of composers invited to participate in the festival is included below.
